"D.C. Department of Transportation is about to begin a major retrofit of all the District's street lights, converting them to energy-efficient LEDs. While this new technology has many wonderful attributes, concerns have been raised about the color of light they emit. So far, DDOT has only installed cool-white LEDs that have a strong blue-wavelength component and produce a harsh, bluish-white light. The American Medical Association has warned that blue-rich LED street lights cause hazardous glare and are potentially harmful to human health because of their disruptive effect on circadian sleep cycles.
